CALL FOR PAPERS Artificial Intelligence and Human Person

The central theme of the upcoming monothematic issue of Divus Thomas is artificial intelligence and its implications for our understanding of human persons. Suppose we accept that artificial intelligence is indeed intelligent, that in the future, it will be more intelligent than humans (superintelligence), and that it may possess consciousness, full autonomy, and even basic rights. What implications would this have for the traditional understanding of human persons as individual substances of a rational nature endowed with free will and moral agency?

We welcome papers addressing the relationship of artificial intelligence to topics such as the nature of human intelligence and human thought, free will and autonomy, consciousness, persistence over time and the possibility of uploading the mind to a computer, fundamental human rights, moral agency, and others.
